Sad News

It is with much sadness we record the death of Cyril Rodger McLeod, of Invercargill. Cyril died on Sunday 5th April doing what he loved. Cyril was hunting roaring stags at Cattle Flat and died as the result of a fall.

Cyril was aged 60 years and had been a hunter all his life. He had been a member of Southland Branch NZDA for many years and served on our executive. Cyril enjoyed taking new members and young hunters into the bush and many of our members have shared a night or two with Cyril in his hut which he built in the Hokonui Hills. In fact Cyril loved everything outdoors, he attended fishing camp at Waituna opening each year. In earlier years he had his own deer pens and trapped possums in the works off season.

A master at improvisation, his interests ranged from building and flying his own micro light airplane to visiting garage sales. One of his hunting mates referred to him as an original; a rough diamond. That he was, but with a genuine interest in people. Cyril was an active member of Search and Rescue and since 1993 was a base operator for Southland Field Radio Service. He will be sadly missed. He is survived by his wife Janice and daughters Carla and Jolie.

The hunting people of New Zealand will all be saddened by the loss of Cyril whose life in the wilds of NZ was a legend.

Working most of his life in the meat works meant that he required something to do in the 'off season'. Many years of possum hunting in the West Coast gave Cyril an intimate knowledge and love of the Southern Alps where he returned time and time again to go after possums and to hunt Chamois and Tahr.

But it was the local Hokonuis that he spent most of his spare time and with a great little hut built on private property he was able to hunt and have somewhere to enjoy his time with family and friends.


Cyril was well known for his hard grip on his wallet and to hunt out a bargain.
