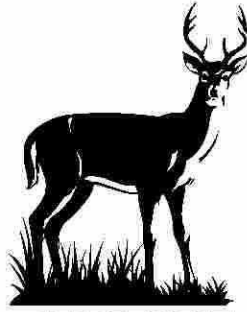

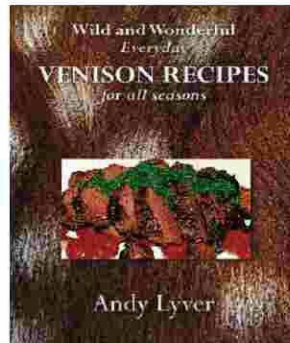

Book Review

The Hunting Tales of PERCY LYES

Hans has done a good job in interviewing and gathering the material for this book before Percy departed for that happy hunting ground in the sky. Percy for those who don't know was one of the top hunters of his generation. He was a government culler who hunted with the Curtis Brothers. In the post second world war era when deer populations were peaking. As a trophy hunter he took some very notable trophies. The record for length, for red deer, and a Moose trophy. Though some will debate whether this should have been shot) He also shot a top Wapiti trophy that was in its day rejected called a Hybrid. Would it be rejected now? Should any Wapiti trophy be rejected because it may have red in it? As after all red deer and their antlers are smaller. I can see a case for excluding anything that may have Wapiti blood from a red competition but not the reverse.

Percy's tales takes in some stories that others have told in their books, but from Percy's prospective. This book is a good read for anybody wanting to read of that long gone era, before Helicopters called in this book BC. But also and perhaps more importantly before commercial venison recovery.

Well worth adding to a collection of books on the great days of Kiwi hunting.
