

Editorial

You all should have got the August National Office Newsletter; it is great to be getting a lot of stuff from National office for a change over the last few years. But for many the finding time to read and study it all can be a problem.

What I am going to discuss is Huts and the articles on them in the newsletter. They have been close to my heart ever since Doc removed the Acton Base hut in the Eyre Mt's around 1990. We were told it was being transported for use in the Auckland Islands. From evidence left behind most was left in a heap where it once stood. The local community rallied and replaced it.

There is we are told over 900 huts on Doc land. And a list with a grading as to current state is provided. To put it bluntly not all of these huts are in the same category, there are Great walks huts and other major walks huts. The standards expected of them I would have thought been different from your average back country hut. They have hut wardens in the season, who should help with maintenance.

Then there are those belonging to those who have various concessions with the Department to have huts on Doc land. From what I know the concession huts are subject to regular inspections and maintenance as conditions of the concessions. The Clean-up and Surveying talked about in the National NZDA newsletter is irrelevant to these two Groups, a waste of time and effort, agree?

Doc is talking of removing 67 of their huts (the ones given the worst scores of 4 or 5.) How accurate are there scores when a hut built in 2018 (Which I have called past twice since and found it in excellent condition as one would expect) gets an average 3 only. One of the ones in danger is close to my heart the George sound hut I stayed there in 1970 on a school trip, a trip that sold me on the outdoors, (we walked in and back how many school parties would do that now).

The reason is money Doc like everybody does not have enough and wants to spend what it has on conserving native species and the environment. This is not helped by the accounting practices being used where Doc must pay depreciation on assets (to Who?). Then if they upgrade something they have to pay more to who on the increased capital value. Sounds like smoke and revolving mirrors to me. I assume this money goes back to the Crown who paid it to Doc in the first place. Looks like a con and fraud.

Perhaps whoever gets this stream of money can pay the hut maintenance? The Department I assume is given various lots of money for various given purposes, (If not it should be). They should not be allowed to use one lot to pay for activities in another field! I understand from what I have found out this is too common a practice in Govt Depts, one of raiding Peter to pay for Paul.

Now a deep thought about Doc and its endangered species list, which I understand is increasing in size, correct? But why, is it all because more of the species on the original list are becoming more endangered? Or could some of it be from changing the criteria of endangered, or because Doc is actively looking for and succeeding in finding new species

a lot of which are then declared endangered? It needs a bottomless bucket to fund this as some desire it to be funded. New Zealand has no such bucket.

The Federated Mountain Clubs of New Zealand have a good idea with their November Love our Huts campaign. But as I have explained above their list needs somewhat refined to target the huts of concern. (Going by the TV1 News 7th Sept Doc's desire for funding may have been a reason for the increased visitor levy of now \$100 for tourists as the Minister of Conservation suggest an increase would help Doc funding, will this take the pressure off the huts).

Meanwhile thanks to the various NZDA Branches, Permolat and others who go out and help maintain the back country huts that are a (Govt) undervalued asset. Plus, a Special mention for Lou Sanson who when in charge of Doc did not allow the removal of any of these vital huts.

Its Conservation Week (was) 2 - 8th September 2024

Southland Branch NZDA conservation contribution.

For the last 18 years Southland Branch NZDA has undertaken a rat control project around a hill section of the Homestead hunting block at Mason Bay on Stewart Island. We have 309 traps set around 14 kilometres of tracks. We send six parties to each year between August and December while the birds are nesting and fledging. Our aim is to give the birds the best chance of survival by removing rats at this time. Up till 2023 we have killed a total of 6008 rats, an average of 353 a year, but in one mast year the total was 1150 rats. The first party for 2024 has just completed and accounted for 73 rats. In recent years we have targeted feral cats with 14 cat traps. We are very grateful to Invercargill Hunting & Fishing store for their generous sponsorship towards the cost of the 6 return flights.

Press release from the office of Nicole McKee: "Rushed gun laws haven't made New Zealanders safer" – 24AUG2024

This month we are going to talk politics again. It was quite entertaining watching journo-flack Jack Tane on TV1 two Sundays ago trying to railroad Nicole McKee, the Associate Minister of Justice (Firearms) into making mistakes during his interview. Nicole knew what she was talking about a lot better than Mr Tane did.

Pathetic whinging from groups opposing any loosening of the controls on firearms and their users suggest Nicole is gaining traction to remove some of the more ridiculous constraints under which we now operate when we use our lawfully held firearms. She is determined to get input from opposition parties to make sure the Arms Act doesn't change every time there is an election. (Heck, back in 2019, we only got a token look in when everything was done so hastily, many amendments had to be made to fix the stuff-ups.)

More politics (sorry!)

Something good from an Australian: David Leyonhjelm served two terms as a Senator in the NSW Parliament, and was chairman of the Shooters Party for six years. He argues that most people don't have a clue about firearms apart from what they see on TV news and in movies. Most of these people (more than 90% of the population) won't know about the noise level of a shot. They do not realise that a sound suppressor just makes things a bit quieter, not totally silent as Hollywood would have us believe. The same goes for police, who are just a subset of the total population. Many of them have few clues about firearms apart from the six hours of so they spend on a range while training.

What this means is that most of our law making about firearms is by people who don't have a clue, part from Nicole McKee. What can we do? COLFO has invited members of Parliament to a range, and they've all enjoyed themselves there as they discovered the fun of shooting (even on a range). The MPs gained more insights into range safety, firearm safety and the joy of firing a good shot. There is no reason our NZDA branches around the

country could not invite local MPs (don't be shy, even opposition MPs appreciate the friendship and entertainment to be found there. Why not give it a go?
