Presidents Report




July 2025

Editorial



They tell us that change is constant, what they did not tell us is that change accelerates as we get older.

This week I had to purchase a new gun safe with hidden hinges for my firearms licence renewal. In the early 1070's when I started hunting, I had to register my rifles, have a permit to procure for a shotgun, and could store them where I liked. Things changed Lifetime licences came at went. Secure storage arrived to keep one's kids from having an accident. Every time the licence was renewed security requirements has increased. With the latest renewals of those who had lifetime licences gun safes are in hot demand at the gun shops. Back to my early hunting days deer were hard to come by venison was worth heaps at the local game depots that bought anything that looked like a deer.

Recreation hunting areas had just arrived to give the recreational hunter a chance. (They too seem a thing of the past as change has occurred, how many young hunters know what they are.). This found me hunting in the Caples valley. Then venturing to Stewart Island as Whitetail there were not hammered as much, and one had a better chance to see/ shoot something.

Over the years the island has provided me with some good hunting. But this is changing as Doc releases 1080 on the Island in concentrations never seen before. Meanwhile the amount of Red and Fallow deer available for hunting in Southland has vastly increased. Due to all the changes in the commercial venison industry that have occurred over my working life in that industry. (That is another story). Along with the various forest ranger groups and the police having more interest in enforcing trespass and firearms laws.

Will all this 1080 being laid on Stewart Island Kill all the rats, possums, and cats. And keep the Island free of these species? I would only give it a 50/50 chance of complete success at best, Will it then be worth it? What will the environmental damage be? What is certain is that it will greatly affect the hunting on the Island, and the viability of businesses that service the hunting there. What future for the Rakiura Hunter Camp Trust huts?

Change is constant what changes the 1080 poisoning of the island will bring will be revealed in time. As I write this change has started 1080 is being laid. I have enjoyed my times there will today's younger hunters be as lucky; it is a great place to hunt.

What has not changed is the constant battle to get and retain recreational hunting in New Zealand for New Zealanders. The baton must pass to the young hunters if they are to continue to enjoy hunting.

Better Hunting education

The Game Animal Council has an online hunter training platform, Better Hunting. It is free to use for hunters and other backcountry users wanting to develop their hunting and outdoor skills.

Better Hunting can be used on a laptop, tablet or phone. Courses can also be accessed offline through the free mobile app. Just create an account and get learning. The platform saves your progress as you go so you can dip in and out as often as you like.

Go to the Better Hunting platform.

Available courses

The Better Hunting platform is made up of separate modules across different subject areas:

- **Hunting Essentials** includes New Zealand specific outdoor and hunter safety and skills with everything from weather forecasting, navigation, river crossing, first aid, preparation, access, game animal management and other bushcraft and hunting skills.
- **Firearms Essentials** is about learning safe and successful firearms use. This includes maintenance, sighting in, storage and transport, and technique.
- **Pig Hunting** is an introductory course to pig hunting in New Zealand, exploring important theory and dog handling techniques and how to get into practical training.
- Better Hunting also includes skill-building games, digital trip intentions, ballot calendars and more.



You will need to bring

Firearms Licence and Deerstalkers membership card.

Ear and eye protection

Target capable of being stapled to the target frame

Rifle (bolt out) + ammo – Up to and including .308/7.62 calibre Bipod or other front support and rear support.

The range will be operated by a designated Rang Officer who will make themselves known at the range.

General format will be

Allocation of target frame

Validation of rifle being able to hit target at 100m Shooting

200m and beyond after validation
