Editorial



As I write this, things are happening out there that affect hunting and our enjoyment of the great New Zealand outdoors.

Moves continue to make the Wapiti heard a heard of Special Interest, something that Forrest and Bird strongly object too, but don't give an alternative plan to achieve the positive outcomes that the Fiordland Wapiti foundation is achieving for the area. Be ready this has to go through a public submission process, each of you need to support this, for the sake of hunting in NZ long term.

The 1080 poison Drop's to protect the Southern Dotterel are going ahead as I write with some hunting blocks impacted. A precursor to poisoning the whole Island with a concentration of 1080 far greater than normally seen in New Zealand over a far greater area. Which will have affects not seen before in New Zealand.

I see on Doc's website plans for more 1080 into the Blue Mt's this spring. Is this the regular stuff or is it the new sausage baits that target Stoats and Cats plus some possums, I hope for the Fallow's sake it is the latter, if the former that good deer repellent is used.

A few days ago, after several years of research by "Milford Opportunities" At great cost (I see a \$18,000,000 figure in one news article) The government made an announcement, which rejects a lot of the ideas the project through up.

The Airfield and flights will remain, public access to the road is to remain, and a new boat ramp for recreational use is proposed, along with some new short walks and other developments. There is to be funding of \$15,200,00 for this. How much more could have been achieved at Milford with less consultants more work.

To me some simple things would solve a lot of Milford's problems.

Encourage tourists to spend one night in Te Anau to shorten the trip, run later ferries on Milford Sound in summer, both of which would reduce the mid-day congestion at Milford. Also ban rental cars and provide a bus alternative from Te Anau which would improve safety.

In the recent past tourists were not encouraged to visit except in the busy part of the day, going by the locked toilets my family found (at the terminal) mid-summer when coming in off the last boat ride for the day.

As it stands the results the Government has come up with will allow us continued access to hunting (& tramping) off the Milford Road, and our kindred fishermen will continue to have access to their fishing. How many of you made a submission on the Milford opportunities project? Have a pat on your back if you put your hand up for sensible! The take home is if you want New Zealand the way you would like it you have to stand up and say so, don't leave it to the other bloke to do it for you. (He is likely expecting you to be standing up for him, so both loose). Or you will get New Zealand the way someone else wants it, or dreams that they would like it.

Better Hunting education

The Game Animal Council has an online hunter training platform, Better Hunting. It is free to use for hunters and other backcountry users wanting to develop their hunting and outdoor skills.

Better Hunting can be used on a laptop, tablet or phone. Courses can also be accessed offline through the free mobile app. Just create an account and get learning. The platform saves your progress as you go so you can dip in and out as often as you like.

Go to the Better Hunting platform.

Available courses

The Better Hunting platform is made up of separate modules across different subject areas:

- **Hunting Essentials** includes New Zealand specific outdoor and hunter safety and skills with everything from weather forecasting, navigation, river crossing, first aid, preparation, access, game animal management and other bushcraft and hunting skills.
- **Firearms Essentials** is about learning safe and successful firearms use. This includes maintenance, sighting in, storage and transport, and technique.
- **Pig Hunting** is an introductory course to pig hunting in New Zealand, exploring important theory and dog handling techniques and how to get into practical training.
- Better Hunting also includes skill-building games, digital trip intentions, ballot calendars and more.





You will need to bring

Firearms Licence and Deerstalkers membership card.

Ear and eye protection

Target capable of being stapled to the target frame

Rifle (bolt out) + ammo – Up to and including .308/7.62 calibre Bipod or other front support and rear support.

The range will be operated by a designated Rang Officer who will make themselves known at the range.

General format will be

Allocation of target frame

Validation of rifle being able to hit target at 100m Shooting

200m and beyond after validation
