Recently I attended the Southern Regional Branches Meeting (NZDA) held in a snow storm at Invercargill. One of the issues raised was the need to vastly increase the membership, to give us the political voice we need to influence Government on such issues as Firearms ownership, and hunting. Talk included paying a full time Executive Officer to manage and promote the organisation, and grow the membership. Also the possibility that New Zealand may follow Australia along the line of being a member of a Firearms/ hunting club as a condition of having a firearms licence.

From where I am looking at this increasing the membership is a necessity if hunting is to thrive and grow in New Zealand.

The first big problem that still needs to be fixed is our current membership records, progress has occurred, but there are still some problems in the resulting list of Southland Branch Members being supplied to the branch.

You should be getting monthly branch newsletters, and a Monthly National newsletter from National Office. (This in passing is a big communication improvement that has occurred this year under our New National President). If you are not receiving both or you stop receiving both (or either) and you are a paid financial member. Please check that your membership is correctly recorded at national level Phone 04 499 6163. Hunters and firearms owners in general must have a stronger and unified voice if we are to continue to enjoy our chosen recreational pursuits. This starts with the individuals

standing up and doing their part. Including not doing things that reflect badly on hunters, i.e. Poaching, shooting up the likes of signs, or using fire arms under the influence of Alcohol. The collective can and will be judged on the actions of a few.

All firearms owners need to be contemplating making a submission on the next Amendment to the Arms Act. This needs to be hand written for maximum effect, as online forms tend to be discounted, and the questions in them are framed to make you give the answers the promoters of document desire. If we can get 10,000 submissions in, in twenty-four or so hours as last time on a Arms Act Amendment. There should be 100,000 plus this time. Your sport is in your hands each and every one of you. It is up to you to be sure you are counted as a member (and being recorded as being a member) and in the submissions you individually make. If you haven't got time now, you may have plenty soon if you can no longer hunt as you desire, Make time to be counted. If you don't stand up don't come crying to me later. Doug Gordon
